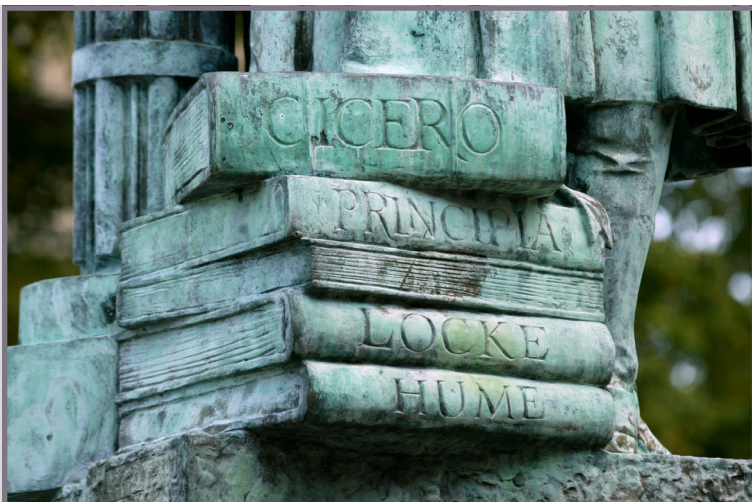
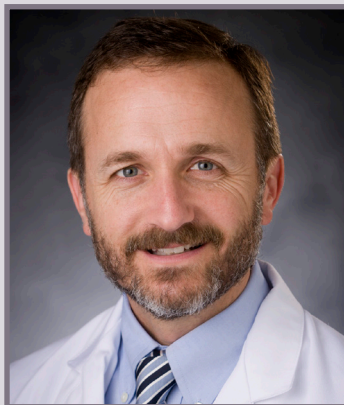


Medical Ethics in the 21st Century: A Natural Law Perspective
